READ a Bible verse or story

1 Thessalonians 4:13-18(NLT)

¹³ And now, dear brothers and sisters, we want you to know what will happen to the believers who have died so you will not grieve like people who have no hope. ¹⁴ For since we believe that Jesus died and was raised to life again, we also believe that when Jesus returns, God will bring back with him the believers who have died. ¹⁵ We tell you this directly from the Lord: We who are still living when the Lord returns will not meet him ahead of those who have died. ¹⁶ For the Lord himself will come down from heaven with a commanding shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trumpet call of God. First, the believers who have died will rise from their graves. ¹⁷ Then, together with them, we who are still alive and remain on the earth will be caught up in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. Then we will be with the Lord forever. ¹⁸ So encourage each other with these words.

TALK about the Bible reading(s)...

- Where can you see resurrection and restoration happening?
- How does this "pattern" of the New Earth being born affect your image of the New Earth? Or does it?

Growing in faith and understanding...

- ❖ In Isaiah we have read: ¹⁷ "See, I will create new heavens and a new earth. The former things will not be remembered, nor will they come to mind."
 - Any reflection?
- ❖ Now Read Revelation 21:3-5

³ And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Look! God's dwelling place is now among the people, and he will dwell with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God. ⁴ 'He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death' or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away." (NIV)

- ❖ Would someone care to reflect on what this passage stirs in you?
- Read 2 Peter3:13 aloud...

¹³ But we are looking forward to the new heavens and new earth he has promised, a world filled with God's righteousness.

- What does this verse tell us about how extensive the restoration will be?
- What do you feel will be restored? And what will the "new" be or look like?
- How will the changes affect our lives?
- Read Genesis 3:14-19 and reflect on how creation was cursed.
 - What things changed on earth because of Adam and Eve's sin in the garden?
 - What would our lives be like when they are restored to God's intended existence?

Read Romans 1:20

²⁰ For since the creation of the world God's invisible qualities—his eternal power and divine nature—have been clearly seen, being understood from what has been made, so that people are without excuse.

- How do you see God's invisible qualities in the world?
- After discussing these qualities are you more hopeful or more concerned for the world?

Recap final discussion about this session...

 How has this session challenged or deepened your understanding of Heaven?
